The 35% reduction applied to the pro-rated fees. The pro-rated fees are calculated quarterly.

At its current stage, Denturism educational institutions across Canada have either been reviewed for accreditation or awaiting their scheduled review. At the end of 2022, George Brown College in Ontario has undergone the accreditation process and received accreditation status. In 2023, Georgian College will be reviewed and in 2024, Oxford College will undergo the accreditation process. By 2024, all Denturism programs in Ontario and across Canada would have received their initial review and accreditation decision. The CDO continues to work in partnership with the Ontario Ministry of Colleges and Universities to assist with the development of a policy directive related to accreditation.

Applicants will be able to upload documents electronically and receive timely updates through the portal and by email. The portal will also include a tool that displays what stage their application is currently in and what the next stages are. The CDO hopes to launch the applicant portal in 2024.
