### Driving Information

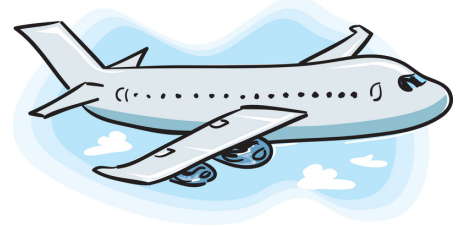
Kelowna is approximately a 7½ hour drive from Calgary, 10½ hours from Edmonton, and 4 from Vancouver.

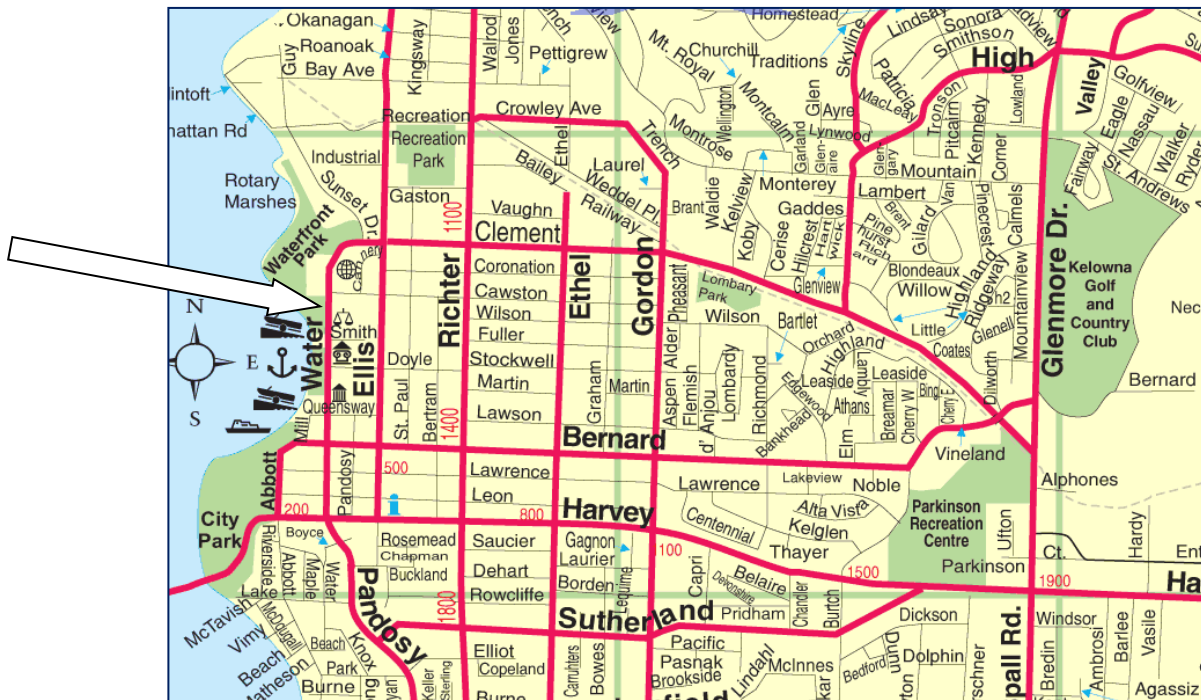

### Convention and Conference Privacy Information Policy

The College of Alberta Denturists (the College) collects information on individuals in the process of registration and conducting its Annual General Meeting of Members and the associated Continuing Competency seminars and exhibit by suppliers.

The type of information collected and held by the College is dependent on whether or not you are a registrant of the courses, meeting, an employee, spouse, presenter, exhibitor, or other individual.

#### **A. Collection of Data**

The College collects and maintains information relating to the provision of services to the registrants, employees, spouses, presenters, exhibitors and other individuals, in this relationship with the College.

The College of Alberta Denturists complies with the requirements of PIPA and the College's Personal Information Code. The information is collected for the following purposes and consent is implied unless an individual advises the College to the contrary:

#### **Primary Purpose**

1. convention registration;
2. continuing competency course registration;
3. annual meeting registration;
4. mailing of registration information;
5. exhibitor solicitations;
6. invoicing;
7. billing information for invoice collection; and
8. communication with registrants and exhibitors on an ad hoc basis.

#### **Secondary Purpose**

1. management and development of the College's business and operations;
2. promotions for the convention and conference activities;
3. introductory matters for presenters at the conference; and
4. other legal and regulatory requirements.

#### **B. Use and Disclosure of Data**

The College will only use or disclose personal information for the purpose it was collected unless the registrant, employee, spouse, presenter, exhibitor or other individual, has expressly not consented to the use or disclosure or where it is necessary due to public health and safety, legal or regulatory requirements.

#### **C. Data Accuracy**

The College will take reasonable steps to ensure that the personal information it collects uses or discloses is accurate, complete and up-to-date.

#### **D. Data Safeguards**

The College will take reasonable steps to protect the personal information it holds from misuse and loss, and from unauthorized access, modification and or disclosure.

#### **E. Access, Correction, and Complaints**

Any registrant, employee, spouse, presenter, exhibitor or other individual, can have access to their personal information held in the College records, upon written request.

You may update or correct your personal information by contacting the College office.

The College will respond to matters of addressing all enquiries or complaints about the College's handling of personal information, through the processes outlined in the College's Personal Information Code. You may contact the College to obtain a copy of our Code, and for the provision of the name of the College's privacy officer.

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### Refund of Fees paid for Registration and Activities at College Conventions Policy

The College of Alberta Denturists policy on the refund of fees paid for registration and activities by application for College conventions is:

1. Zero to One (0-1) week prior to convention: No refund of Fees;
2. One to Two (1-2) weeks prior to convention: Fifty percent (50%) of Fees;
3. Two to Four (2-4) weeks prior to convention: Seventy-five percent (75%) of Fees; and
4. Four plus (4+) weeks prior to convention: Full Refund.

In the case of extenuating circumstances and where a registrant requests within zero to four (0-4) weeks prior to the convention, a refund of fees paid, the registrant may submit a typewritten, dated and signed letter to the College with explanation of the extenuating circumstances, for review and consideration by the Council.

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### Fees for Registration at College Conventions Policy

The College of Alberta Denturists policy on fees for applications for registration at College conventions (and any chosen functions at the convention) is:

1. Four (4+) weeks plus prior to convention: Full Payment of Fees;
  2. One (1) to Four (4) weeks prior to convention: Full Payment of Fees plus \$250.00 late fee;
  3. Less than one (1) week prior to convention: No registration accepted.
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## Annual General Meeting of Regulated Members

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The College's Annual General Meeting of Regulated Members will be held on Saturday, June 30<sup>th</sup>, in the South Ballroom at the Delta Grand Okanagan Resort & Conference Centre.

Formal notification will be provided to the Regulated Members, along with the usual documents for the meeting.

There is no fee for the Regulated Members to attend the meeting and breakfast and lunch is included; however, the College respectfully requests that you indicate on your registration form, if you will be attending the meeting and if you will be enjoying the lunch. This is needed in order to provide the hotel with the appropriate number of meals to make.

As per policy, non-regulated members may register to attend the meeting, but are required to identify themselves at the beginning of the meeting and provide an explanation as to the purpose of their attendance at the meeting. There is a fee for non-members, spouses and staff, which cover the expenses. If you wish to register a non-member for the meeting, please complete that section on your registration form.

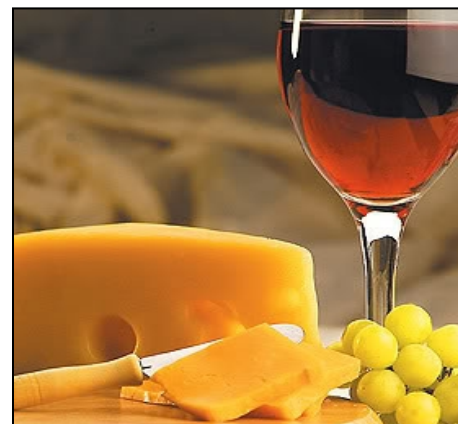

He was a member of the Canadian Council of Denturists Educators and was also a Fellow to the Canadian Academy of Denturists. He was the NAIT representative on both the accreditation committee for the Denturist Association of Canada and the examination committee for the Alberta Board of Examiners. Mr. Cooper has lectured on denturists topics across Canada and the USA. While at NAIT he actively invested in property during his time away from NAIT. In late 2009 he began purchasing land from Larrera Venture Inc. 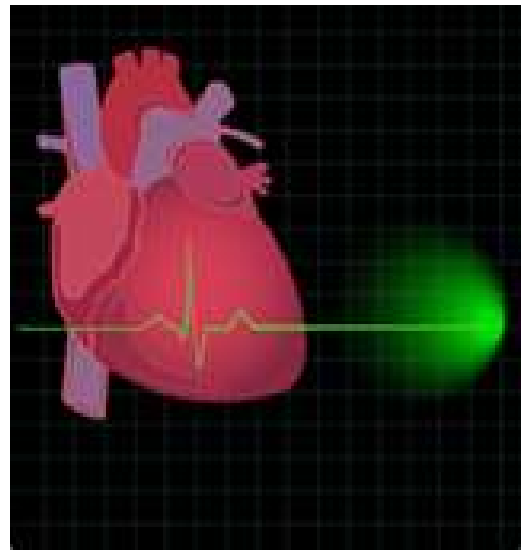
